A BILL

- To amend the National and Community Service Act of 1990 to establish an Office of Civic Bridgebuilding within the Corporation for National and Community Service, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Building Civic Bridges5 Act".

1 SEC. 2. CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING.

2 Subtitle H of title I of the National and Community
3 Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12653 et seq.) is amended
4 by adding at the end the following:

5 **"PART VI—CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING**

6 "SEC. 198T. OFFICE OF CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING.

7 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There shall be in the Cor8 poration an Office of Civic Bridgebuilding (in this section
9 referred to as the 'Office'). The Office shall be headed by
10 an Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding, who shall be designated
11 by the Chief Executive Officer pursuant to section 195(b).

12 "(b) DUTIES.—The Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding13 shall carry out each of the following:

"(1) Administer the grant program described in
subsection (d) to support civic bridgebuilding across
the United States, including by establishing standardized criteria (based on principles of scientific research) to track the effectiveness of projects and activities funded under such program.

"(2) Support the Corporation in providing
training in skills and techniques relevant to civic
bridgebuilding (with the consideration of best practices collected by the Office, including through input
from the Advisory Committee under subsection
(c))—

1	"(A) for participants (including individuals
2	who have been selected to be participants) of a
3	program receiving funding under a national
4	service law; and
5	"(B) upon request by an organization that
6	receives funding under a national service law or
7	that is carrying out a program in which partici-
8	pants described in subparagraph (A) are par-
9	ticipating, for such organization.
10	"(3) Select the members of the Advisory Com-
11	mittee under subsection (c).
12	"(4) Support research and evaluations on civic
13	bridgebuilding and the dissemination of related in-
14	formation, including through—
15	"(A) evaluation and oversight of the grant
16	program described in subsection (d);
17	"(B) as the Corporation determines nec-
18	essary, collaboration (including through the
19	evaluation of the activities of the Corporation
20	relating to civic bridgebuilding and civic en-
21	gagement) between the Office and other offices
22	(such as the Office of Research and Evalua-
23	tion), teams, or individuals within the Corpora-
24	tion; and

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1 "(C) the establishment of a publicly-avail-2 able collection of publications for a research 3 base for the purposes of monitoring national 4 metrics for civic bridgebuilding and assembling 5 research focused on evaluating the extent to 6 which civic bridgebuilding and civic engagement 7 activities strengthen or weaken other civic 8 bridgebuilding and civic engagement activities 9 and outcomes in the United States. 10 "(5) Activate a public conversation about the 11 importance of civic bridgebuilding by convening and 12 coordinating civic bridgebuilding programs and pro-13 viding resources, networking, and collaboration op-14 portunities to individuals and entities in the civic 15 bridgebuilding field, such as through— "(A) network cultivation to strengthen the 16 17 community of those involved, interested, or en-18 gaged in the civic bridgebuilding field, including 19 through activities such as— "(i) in-person and virtual events for 20 21 the public to showcase impactful practices, 22 bring civic bridgebuilding leaders together, 23 present relevant research, and explore 24 emerging needs that would benefit from

2	needs];
3	"(ii) organizing peer-learning opportu-
4	nities to facilitate conversations within the
5	civic bridgebuilding field;
6	"(iii) organizing and distributing lists
7	of civic bridgebuilding leaders and organi-
8	zations and groups in the civic
9	bridgebuilding field; and
10	"(iv) coordinating national commu-
11	nications among civic bridgebuilding lead-
12	ers, including through the promotion of
13	civic bridgebuilding programs and sharing
14	stories of local impact; and
15	"(B) developing or distributing resources
16	to expand best practices in the civic
17	bridgebuilding field, including through—
18	"(i) the curation of a digital resource
19	hub focused on sharing resources from en-
20	tities that receive grants under subsection
21	(d), civic bridgebuilding leaders, civic
22	bridgebuilding programs, or the publicly-
23	available collection of publications for a re-
24	search base established under paragraph
25	(4)(C); and

1	"(ii) the production of new resources,
2	training, or best practices based on lessons
3	from the civic bridgebuilding field.
4	"(c) Advisory Committee.—
5	"(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established
6	within the Office of Civic Bridgebuilding an Advi-
7	sory Committee.
8	"(2) Members.—
9	"(A) SELECTION.—The Advisory Com-
10	mittee shall be composed of 9 members selected
11	by the Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding, including
12	a member designated by the Officer of Civic
13	Bridgebuilding as the Chairperson of the Advi-
14	sory Committee, and such members shall be
15	civic bridgebuilding leaders—
16	"(i) who represent diverse ideological,
17	religious, racial, regional, or ethnic commu-
18	nities; and
19	"(ii) with relevant experience and ex-
20	pertise from the civic bridgebuilding field.
21	"(B) TERMS OF SERVICE.—A member of
22	the Advisory Committee shall serve for a term
23	of 3 years.
24	"(3) DUTIES.—The Advisory Committee shall
25	carry out each of the following:

1	"(A) Provide advice and consultation to
2	the Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding on the prior-
3	ities and administration of the Office.
4	"(B) Conduct an annual review of grants
5	awarded under subsection (d), with a focus on
6	diversity, equity, and inclusion, and identifying
7	any gaps or needs that emerged in an applica-
8	tion cycle.
9	"(C) Conduct an annual review of the
10	process of awarding grants under subsection
11	(d), including a review of rubrics or metrics for
12	selection of grant recipients used by the Officer
13	of Civic Bridgebuilding.
14	"(D) Review the analysis provided under
15	the peer review process under subsection $(d)(5)$.
16	"(d) Civic Bridgebuilding Pilot Grant Pro-
17	GRAM.—
18	"(1) IN GENERAL.—From the amounts appro-
19	priated to carry out this subsection, the Corporation
20	(acting through the Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding
21	and in consultation with the Advisory Committee es-
22	tablished under subsection (c))—
23	"(A) shall carry out a pilot program for a
24	3-year period to award grants, on a competitive
25	basis, to eligible entities to support civic

1	bridgebuilding programs across the United
2	States; and
3	"(B) may carry out such a pilot program
4	for additional 3-year periods.
5	"(2) GRANT PERIOD.—A grant awarded under
6	this subsection shall be for a 1-year period. Grants
7	shall be awarded under this subsection in 3 grant
8	cycles for each 3-year period of the program carried
9	out under paragraph (1).
10	"(3) Application.—To be eligible to receive a
11	grant under this subsection, an eligible entity shall
12	submit an application to the Corporation at such
13	time, in such manner, and containing such informa-
14	tion and assurances as the Corporation may require,
15	including—
16	"(A) a description of the project that will
17	be funded with the grant;
18	"(B) an explanation of how that such
19	project will—
20	"(i) engage diverse communities;
21	"(ii) facilitate the establishment or
22	continuation of civic bridgebuilding, which
23	may include addressing the root causes of
24	polarization as articulated in the publicly-
25	available collection of publications for a re-

1	search base established under subsection
2	(b)(4)(C);
3	"(iii) reflect research supporting the
4	efficacy and impact of the proposed ap-
5	proach for the project; and
6	"(iv) ensure physical, social, and psy-
7	chological safety for all participants in-
8	volved in the project;
9	"(C) a description of evidence-based best
10	practices for how such safety will be achieved;
11	and
12	"(D) an assurance that the eligible entity
13	will report outcomes of such project to track ef-
14	fectiveness based on standardized criteria estab-
15	lished by the Office of Civic Bridgebuilding
16	under subsection $(b)(1)$ or will evaluate the im-
17	pact of such project based on principles of sci-
18	entific research.
19	"(4) USES OF FUNDS.—An eligible entity re-
20	ceiving a grant under this subsection shall use the
21	grant funds to carry out a project to advance civic
22	bridgebuilding in communities across the United
23	States, which may include addressing the root
24	causes of polarization as articulated in the publicly-

3	"(5) PEER REVIEW PROCESS.—The Corporation
4	shall establish a peer review process which shall in-
5	clude consultation with research communities in the
6	civic bridgebuilding field to analyze the process of
7	awarding grants (and the grants that are awarded)
8	under this subsection.
9	"(e) Comptroller General.—The Comptroller
10	General of the United States shall, on an annual basis,
11	submit to Congress a report, which summarizes and as-
12	sesses the effectiveness and impact of the activities carried
13	out under grants awarded under subsection (d).
14	"(f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
15	"(1) CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING.—The term 'civic
16	bridgebuilding'—
17	"(A) means an activity that—
18	"(i) fosters respect between diverse
19	communities;
20	"(ii) strengthens relationships across
21	lines of difference;
22	"(iii) forges a sense of common civic
23	purpose; and
24	"(iv) seeks to solve a community prob-
25	lem and diminish polarization; and

1	"(B) includes—
2	"(i) activities that take place in local
3	communities, where individuals and insti-
4	tutions come together to build empathy,
5	strengthen belonging, and address local
6	issues; and
7	"(ii) activities at the field level, where
8	civic bridgebuilding leaders work together
9	to share research and best practices, learn
10	from one another, and grow other civic
11	bridgebuilding.
12	"(2) CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING LEADER.—The
13	term 'civic bridgebuilding leader' means an indi-
14	vidual who leads civic bridgebuilding programs or ef-
15	forts.
16	"(3) CIVIC ENGAGEMENT.—The term 'civic en-
17	gagement' means an individual or collective action
18	designed to address a public concern or an unmet
19	human, educational, health care, environmental, or
20	public safety need.
21	"(4) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term 'eligible en-
22	tity' means a nonprofit entity, public institution, ele-
23	mentary school, secondary school, institution of
24	higher education, religious group, or consortium of
25	any such entities.

"(5) PUBLIC INSTITUTION.—The term 'public
 institution' means a library or unit of State, local,
 or special purpose government.

4 "(6) RESEARCH.—The term 'research' means
5 research which embodies principles of scientific re6 search.

7 "(7) RESEARCH BASE.—The term 'research 8 base' means any publications that contain observa-9 tions, analysis, and conclusions based on principles 10 of scientific research with respect to the challenges 11 of political and social polarization in the United 12 States, and practical approaches to strengthen social cohesion, foster a sense of national connection, or 13 14 improve intergroup relations in divided communities. 15 "(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section 16 17 \$25,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2023 through 2025.". 18 SEC. 3.
