Weatherization is a powerful tool for lowering utility bills

- Over 40+ years, America's **Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) has helped more than 7.4 million low-income households** make their homes safer, healthier & more energy efficient
- Based in the U.S. Department of Energy, **WAP has supported programs in all 50 states**, the District of Columbia, five U.S. territories, and three tribal governments
- The program benefits workers and small businesses, **directly supporting more than 8,500 jobs** and thousands more in related industries

The evidence is clear: weatherization pays the bills

- Low-income households pay 7.2% of household income on energy, more than three times the amount that higher income households pay
- An independent review by Oak Ridge National Laboratory found that each Weatherization program dollar delivers \$4.50 in benefits including energy savings and improved health & safety



Congress Needs to Step Up!

- Each weatherization dollar delivers \$4.50 in benefits in energy savings, health & safety
- Since 1976, DOE's weatherization program has helped low-income households make their homes safer, healthier, and more energy efficient
- The most recent authorization of the program expired in 2012
- Other aspects of the program can be modernized and improved

The Legislation

- FULL TITLE: The Weatherization Enhancement and Local Energy Efficiency Investment and Accountability Act
- Reauthorizes the Weatherization Assistance Program at \$350 million through Fiscal Year 2024
- Modernizes the definition of weatherization materials to include renewable energy technologies and other advanced technologies
- Allows re-weatherization of homes 15 years after past weatherization services were completed
- Creates a small, competitive grant program to support innovative weatherization practices

Weatherization is a smart, cost-effective way to lower energy costs for America's most vulnerable households. It's time for Congress to update the nation's largest residential energy efficiency program!
