There are several additional steps you can and should take to ensure you get the support you need and expedite this process. We suggest the following:

Step 1	Register for State Department alerts and other messages through the Smart Traveler
_	Enrollment Program (STEP) at http://step.state.gov . (Google Chrome or Internet
	Explorer 11 with compatibility view works best).

- Step 2 Remain in contact with your commercial carrier regarding options to depart.
- Step 3 Reach out directly to the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate with your name, date of birth, passport number, contact information, any special needs, your specific location, and any exigent circumstances.
- Step 4 Keep checking the U.S. Embassy website in your respective country as well as travel.state.gov for updated information.
