 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Building Civic Bridges5 Act".

1 SEC. 2. CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING.

Subtitle H of title I of the National and Community
Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12653 et seq.) is amended
by adding at the end the following:

5 "PART VI—CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING

6 "SEC. 198T. OFFICE OF CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING.

"(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There shall be in the Corporation an Office of Civic Bridgebuilding (in this section
referred to as the 'Office'). The Office shall be headed by
an Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding, who shall be designated
by the Chief Executive Officer pursuant to section 195(b).

12 "(b) DUTIES.—The Officer of Civic Bridgebuilding13 shall carry out each of the following:

14 "(1) Administer the grant program described in 15 subsection (d) to support civic bridgebuilding across 16 the United States, including by establishing stand-17 ardized criteria (based on principles of scientific re-18 search and input through the consultation process 19 under subsection (c)) to track the effectiveness of 20 projects and activities funded under such program.

21 "(2) Support the Corporation in providing
22 training in skills and techniques relevant to civic
23 bridgebuilding (based on principles of scientific re24 search and input through the consultation process
25 under subsection (c))—

| 14 | "(A) evaluation and oversight of the grant |
| 15 | program described in subsection (d); |
| 16 | "(B) as the Corporation determines nec- |
| 17 | essary, collaboration (including through the |
| 18 | evaluation of the activities of the Corporation |
| 19 | relating to civic bridgebuilding and civic en- |
| 20 | gagement) between the Office and- |
| 21 | "(i) other offices (such as the Office |
| 22 | of Research and Evaluation), teams, or in- |
| 23 | dividuals within the Corporation; and |
| 24 | "(ii) other Federal agencies, including |
| 25 | the Community Relations Service of the |

1 Department of Justice, the United States 2 Agency for International Development, and 3 the United States Institute of Peace; and "(C) the establishment of a publicly avail-4 5 able collection of publications for a research 6 base for the purpose of assembling research fo-7 cused on evaluating the extent to which civic 8 bridgebuilding and civic engagement activities 9 strengthen or weaken other civic bridgebuilding 10 and civic engagement activities and outcomes in 11 the United States. 12 "(4) Activate and sustain a public conversation

13 about the importance of civic bridgebuilding by con-14 vening and coordinating civic bridgebuilding pro-15 grams and providing resources, networking, and col-16 laboration opportunities to individuals and entities in 17 the civic bridgebuilding field for the purpose of dis-18 seminating and refining best practices based on 19 principles of scientific research and input through 20 the consultation process under subsection (c).

21 "(c) CONSULTATION PROCESS.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the duties
under this section, the Officer of Civic
Bridgebuilding shall consult with members of the
civic bridgebuilding field, including for purposes of—

| 15 | diverse ideological, religious, racial, regional, profes- |

| 17 | bers— |
| 18 | "(A) who represent eligible entities en- |
| 19 | gaged in civic bridgebuilding; |
| 20 | "(B) who represent existing or potential |
| 21 | programs and grantees receiving funding under |

| 24 | "(C) who are researchers producing work |
| 25 | based on principles of scientific research related |

| 20 | "(D) an assurance that the eligible entity |
| 21 | will report outcomes of such project to track ef- |
| 22 | fectiveness based on standardized criteria estab- |
| 23 | lished by the Office of Civic Bridgebuilding |
| 24 | under subsection (b)(1). |

"(4) USES OF FUNDS.—An eligible entity re ceiving a grant under this subsection shall use the
 grant funds to carry out a project to advance civic
 bridgebuilding in communities across the United
 States.

6 "(e) COMPTROLLER GENERAL.—The Comptroller 7 General of the United States shall, not later than 18 8 months after the end of the 3-year period of the program carried out under subsection (d)(1)(A) and, as applicable, 9 not later than 18 months after each 3-year period of the 10 11 program carried out under subsection (d)(1)(B), submit to Congress a report, which summarizes and assesses the 12 13 effectiveness and impact of the activities carried out under grants awarded under subsection (d). 14

15 "(f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

16 ''(1) CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING.—The term 'civic
17 bridgebuilding'—

18 "(A) means an activity, grounded in prin-19 ciples of scientific research, that—

20 "(i) fosters respect between diverse21 communities;

22 "(ii) supports social cohesion and di-23 minishes polarization;

24 "(iii) forges a sense of common civic25 purpose; and

| 16 | "(2) CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING FIELD.—The term |
| 17 | 'civic bridgebuilding field' means— |
| 18 | "(A) the programs, leaders, and commu- |
| 19 | nity groups involved in civic bridgebuilding ac- |
| 20 | tivities; |
| 21 | "(B) researchers producing work based on |
| 22 | principles of scientific research related to civic |
| 23 | bridgebuilding in the United States and abroad; |
| 24 | and |

"(C) Federal agencies and public institu tions engaged in or supporting work related to
 civic bridgebuilding in the United States and
 internationally.

5 "(3) CIVIC BRIDGEBUILDING LEADER.—The 6 term 'civic bridgebuilding leader' means an indi-7 vidual who leads civic bridgebuilding programs or ef-8 forts.

9 "(4) CIVIC ENGAGEMENT.—The term 'civic en-10 gagement' means an individual or collective action 11 designed to address a public concern such as an 12 unmet human, educational, health care, environ-13 mental, or public safety need.

14 "(5) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term 'eligible en15 tity' means a nonprofit entity, community- or faith16 based organization, institution of higher education
17 (as defined in section 101(a) of the Higher Edu18 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001(a))), public in19 stitution, or consortium of any such entities.

20 "(6) PUBLIC INSTITUTION.—The term 'public
21 institution' means a library or unit of State, local,
22 or special purpose government.

23 "(7) RESEARCH BASE.—The term 'research
24 base' means any publications that contain observa25 tions, analysis, and conclusions based on principles

of scientific research with respect to the challenges 1 2 of political and social polarization in the United 3 States, and practical approaches to strengthen social 4 cohesion, foster a sense of national connection, or 5 improve intergroup relations in divided communities. 6 "(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There 7 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section 8 \$15,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2025 through 2027.". 9 SEC. 3.
