

Key Wins for Delaware in the CJS, Interior, and Energy & Water Appropriations Package:

Listed below are the congressionally directed funding projects secured by the Delaware delegation included in the appropriations package heading to the President's desk. This is funding that goes directly to organizations in Delaware communities to support Delawareans. The total for all projects is more than \$40 million.

Christiana Care Health Services	\$500,000	Funds will be used to support the operations of the Gene Editing Institute and support CRISPR gene editing science for students.
City of Milford Police Department	\$435,000	Funds will be used to purchase a specialty emergency rescue vehicle.
Community Legal Aid Society, Inc. of Delaware	\$400,000	Funds will be used to make technology improvements to improve the delivery of legal aid services to clients.
Delaware Department of Correction	\$350,000	Funds will be used to for safety improvements at correctional centers, including new camera systems.
Delaware Division of Forensic Science	\$700,000	Funds will be used to purchase toxicology equipment essential in reducing overdose deaths and improving public health.
Delaware State University	\$1,200,000	Funds will be used to purchase public safety equipment, including technology and vehicles.
Executive Office of the Governor	\$450,000	Funds will be used to stand up the Police Officer Standards and Training Commission.
New Castle County	\$1,031,000	Funds will be used to purchase police vehicles.
Partners for Justice	\$197,000	Funds will be used to hire additional staff to expand the partnership with the Delaware Office of Defense Services.
Town of Dewey Beach	\$443,000	Funds will be used to purchase police equipment.
Town of Viola	\$75,000	Funds will be used to purchase a police cruiser.
University of Delaware	\$3,604,000	Funds will be used to purchase biopharmaceutical manufacturing equipment to support NIIMBL.
University of Delaware	\$1,031,000	Funds will be used to conduct maintenance on the Hugh R. Sharp research vessel.
Wilmington Police Department	\$400,000	Funds will be used to purchase a specialty emergency rescue vehicle.
U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Construction	\$10,000,000	Funds will be used for beach replenishment on the Delaware coast from Cape Henlopen to Fenwick Island.
U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Construction	\$1,000,000	Funds will be used to address flooding near Water Street in the city of Dover.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Construction	\$600,000	Funds will be used for continued operation of the sand bypass system at the Indian River Inlet.
U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Construction	\$50,000	Funds will be used to address flooding along White Clay Creek in New Castle County.
U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Investigations	\$800,000	Funds will be used to continue development of the Delaware Inland Bays and Delaware Bay Coast Storm Risk Management Feasibility Study.
U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Investigations	\$200,000	Funds will be used to carry out a feasibility study to reduce flooding in Wilmington.
University of Delaware	\$5,000,000	Funds will be used to purchase equipment to support the Center for Clean Hydrogen.
City of Seaford	\$2,300,000	Funds will be used to upgrade the emergency power system and expand capacity of the wastewater treatment facility.
City of Wilmington	\$2,800,000	Funds will be used to upgrade the aeration and final basin structure at the wastewater treatment facility.
Delaware Africa Coalition	\$500,000	Funds will be used for historic preservation efforts of the Bechtel House on the Ivyside Farm in Wilmington.
Delaware Historical Society	\$400,000	Funds will be used for historic preservation efforts of Old Town Hall in Wilmington.
Delaware Natural Resources and Environmental Control	\$150,000	Funds will be used for well and sensor installation to monitor saltwater intrusion.
Grand Opera House	\$500,000	Funds will be used for historic preservation efforts of the Grand Opera House.
Historic Buttonwood Colored School	\$500,000	Funds will be used for historic preservation efforts of the Buttonwood Colored School Museum and Community Center.
Kent County Levy Court	\$2,600,000	Funds will be used to replace a wastewater main pipe across the Murderkill River.
Partnership for the Delaware Estuary	\$500,000	Funds will be used to develop a mussel rearing network and install living shorelines along the Delaware River to control erosion.
Rehoboth Art League	\$100,000	Funds will be used for historic preservation efforts of the Peter Marsh Homestead.
Smyrna Clayton Heritage Association	\$450,000	Funds will be used for historic preservation efforts of the Smyrna Opera House.
STRIDE Center for PFAS Solutions	\$400,000	Funds will be used to purchase equipment to monitor PFAS and other contaminants in Delaware water.
Town of Smyrna	\$1,092,000	Funds will be used to construct a new well and water treatment plant.
