

## **Key Wins for Delaware in the Five Bill Appropriations Package:**

Listed below are the congressionally directed funding projects secured by Senator Chris Coons included in the appropriations package passed by the Senate. This is funding that goes directly to organizations in Delaware communities to support Delawareans. The total for all projects is more than \$68 million.
